Information for Graduating seniors

Deadline for Applications: April 2, 2018

To be considered for a Dunedin Youth Guild, Inc. Scholarship, you must

1. Graduate from Dunedin High School and/or live in Dunedin (if you attend a high school outside of Dunedin)
2. Graduate in the current year 2018
3. Be in the upper 25% of your class. Class placement is documented on your current transcript.
4. Possess traits of character which are recognized as admirable. This will be indicated by information on your application, specifically your references as well as your volunteer efforts in both school and community.
5. Exhibit need of financial assistance. This is documented in the following ways: financial information on the FASFA, tax returns, other family and/or personal circumstances documented in your application

Information for Continuing College Students

To be considered for a Dunedin Youth Guild Continuing Scholarship you must

1. Be a recipient of a Dunedin Youth Guild Scholarship in a previous year.
2. Submit the following information to Dunedin Youth Guild by June 15th of each year you request continuing funds:
 - a. Your Fall and Spring Transcripts
 - b. A letter requesting continuing scholarship funds
3. In order to qualify for continuing scholarship funds the following criteria must be met:
 - a. Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0
 - b. Be enrolled as a full-time student

****Note- All scholarship awards are paid directly to the college/university**

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SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

1. Complete application in its entirety. All questions must be answered and all other requested material must be supplied with your application. All information that you supply is held in a confidential nature and all applications are shredded at the end of the process to insure the confidentiality of your information.
2. A personal interview will be required. Interviews will be scheduled by school counselors.
- 3 Please attach the following:
 - An official transcript from the high school you currently attend, including SAT and/or ACT scores
 - At LEAST two letters of recommendation, including,
 - a. One from a member of the faculty at your school; and
 - b. One from another adult not related to you (friend, clergy, doctor, etc.).
 - Copy of your FAFSA **AND** SAR (Student Aid Report. **Not** your confirmation page) **OR** your parents' current and complete income tax (the income tax form is not required if you submit a copy of your FAFSA)
 - Photograph of yourself
 - Resume that provides information related to school, community, and church activities in which you have participated and awards or recognitions received
 - Reminder: Page 2 of the application requires both parent/guardian **and** student signatures.
